

## Teaching Consent at Barwic parade

Consent is initially taught in the Autumn Term when we explore 'Safe Relationships' in our PSCHÉ lessons.



During the EYFS children learn to recognise their own feelings within relationships and **how to say no if they don't want to do something.**



During Key Stage 1; the Year 1 children learn to recognise the importance of privacy to keep themselves safe including **seeking permission.** Alongside the Year 2 children learning to know how to **manage secrets;** resist pressure and get help.



During Lower Key Stage 2; the Year 3 children learn to be able to respond to hurtful behaviour, **managing confidentiality and recognise risks** online. Alongside the Year 4 children learning to know that there are **personal boundaries** and how to safely respond to others.



During Upper Key Stage 2; the children learn to understand **appropriate physical contact and how to feel safe** Alongside the Year 6 children learning to recognise and manage peer pressure exploring **consent in different situations.**

We continually revisit consent throughout the year within PSCHÉ sessions and often through Restorative Practice conversations with children. The NSPCC pants campaign is used every year to ensure children remain safe. Children revisit consent discretely again in 'Growing and Changing'.
